Mrs. Robinson, 96, passed away peacefully on Sept. 16 at Northern Louisiana Medical Center in Ruston.

Doris Mott was born on May 2, 1919, to John and Lillian Mott. She was a graduate from McKinley High School and later attended Southern University. She attended and graduated from Leland College in 1941. She met the love of her life, Eddie G. Robinson, and they were married on June 24, 1941. To their union, were their children Lillian Rose and Eddie, Jr., who preceded her in death.

Mrs. Robinson worked as a teacher in the Lincoln Parish school system and prepared students in speech for the Louisiana State Literary Competition. After her retirement as a teacher, Mrs. Robinson began traveling with her husband and the Grambling State University football team.
